
Four patch (triangles) from the book *Sensational Quilts for Scrap* Lovers by Judy Guatnier. Quilting is by Sarah Yoder Parker.






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Modern Mystery Quilt Along 2023 (by Modern Quilt Society). Quilting is by Sarah Yoder Parker.




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


Diedre Fleener






I read this in a blog. "Donation quilts should be nice enough to "hurt" a little when given." Yes, they hurt a little. The following seven quilts are going to the guild's service donations.

When I feel like sewing, but not thinking about color and design, I am hand cranking a 1890s Wheeler & Wilson sewing machine to make a one patch using 2 inch cut red squares and 2 inch cut bright squares. Hand cranking and treadling helps slow down my brain and is much like meditating.

This first quilt is adapted from a Ricky Tims pattern found in an unremembered magazine. Quilting is by Katherine Kona.





This is an improve xperiment quilt top. Used part of a "layer cake" and stash solids. Quilting is by Katherine Kona.





This was an experiment using improv star blocks. Quilting is by Katherine Kona.







I saw a quilt in a magazine or blog that was named *Stop Light*. I used stash strips and scrap 2.5 inch squares. This was a color experiment like all of the quilts that I donated. Quilting is by Katherine Kona.





Another experiment. I purchased four packs of mini charms from Tuesday Morning. Two were blue and two were cream. Blue and cream/white are easy to use together. Quilting is by Katherine Kona.


This was an experiment in using dots and bright 2.5 inch squares. Quilting is by Katherine Kona.
