COMMITTEE REPORTS:

Technology: Joleen thanked the committee for coordinating this evening's Zoom session.

Treasurer: Laura Hopkins recapped the vote for increasing the monthly fee to Our Redeemer Lutheran Church. Board members voted to increase the fee to \$125 per month.

Secretary, Finance, History, and Small Group Committees had no reports.

Library: There will be no library offerings next month due to the Sew Day.

Membership: There are currently 121 members in OCQG.

Retreat: There is one opening left for the February 13-15 retreat. The fall retreat will be October 2-4. Prairie Woods is increasing the cost of their food service. The committee is looking into other options and how this may impact the retreat fee. Possibilities include ordering in food, dining out, or bringing/cooking food at Prairie Woods.

Service Committee: Sherrie Adkison reported that 1) Seven quilts were donated between November and January. 2) Fifteen quilts are awaiting long-arming. 3) Dance Marathon requested a Hawkeye quilt for their event. Sherry recently completed one and will donate it on behalf of the guild. 4) Ronald McDonald House is seeking young adult and adult-sized quilts. Clarification is needed re desired sizes as well as where the quilts are going since the guild is already donating to UIHC Stead Family Hospital. Sherrie will get clarification and report back.

Program: Next month's meeting is February 9th. It will be a Sew Day so there will be no business meeting. More information about Sew Day will be available on the website. The March meeting will be taught by Joleen Green on her "Quick Tie" method. She requested that members bring perle cotton thread, scissors and thimble as the guild members will utilize her method on red, white and blue quilts to be used for the VA donations later this year.
